



FAMILY VOLUNTEERING

As Generation SERVE's flagship program, our Family Volunteering Program allows families with children and teens ages 3-17 to volunteer in the community nearly every day of the year! Free and accessible to the general public without the requirement of a long-term commitment, we want to make it easy for families to give back together.

By coordinating meaningful service opportunities that are a win-win for both our volunteers and nonprofit partners, we strive to create a culture of consistent, on-going service.

In 2019, we continued to expand our age-specific opportunities through two special projects of our Family Volunteering Program:

Little Helpers Learn & Play and Dedicated Family Placements. By providing opportunities for our smallest community members to be introduced to service, and then offering opportunities for deeper, more engaging volunteer opportunities as they reach their teen years, we're aiming to extend both ends of our Service Pathway.

LITTLE HELPERS **LEARN & PLAY**

Throughout 2019, Generation SERVE continued to introduce some of the youngest members of our community to volunteerism through our Little Helpers Learn & Play program, hosted in the spring, summer, and fall. Over 6 weeks, young volunteers (ages 3-5)

volunteered alongside a parent or caregiver in a cohort- and play-based setting. Each week, our "Little Helpers" would learn about a community issue through a story or song, complete an age-appropriate service project, and wrap-up with discussion and playtime. Participating families were exposed to a variety of nonprofits and community needs, like-minded families, and tangible ways to engage their little ones in service.

Brothers Elliott (5) and Everett (3)

participated in the program over the summer, serving alongside their parents, Sarah and Albert. They had such a positive experience, the family participated in the program a second time just a few months later! Reflecting on Little Helpers, Sarah and Albert told us, "The program helped Elliott and Everett see their potential to affect others in a positive way and find joy in helping others."

DEDICATED FAMILY PLACEMENTS

Building on the success of Dedicated Family Placements piloted in 2018, Generation SERVE expanded the program to include new partners and opportunities! Generation SERVE teens, serving alongside a parent or caregiver, committed to an on-going volunteer placement with the same nonprofit over a period of weeks.

> Over spring break and throughout the summer, Generation SERVE partnered with Colin's Hope and the Texas Parks Department to host Water Safety Teams at McKinney Falls State Park, educating park-goers on drowning prevention. Sisters Clare and Niamh (14 and 11, respectively) volunteered alongside her mom, Kate, to welcome and educate park-goers on drowning prevention and water safety.

Kate shared, "participating in the Water Safety Team at McKinney

Falls was the most meaningful volunteer opportunity we have had. The idea of really changing the trajectory for a family visiting the falls was very important to my daughters and I; we learned a lot ourselves and have shared the information with countless others."

SERVICE LEARNING

Throughout 2019, 78 youth in 3rd -5th grade participated in our Service Learning programs, focused on serving animals, their peers, nature, people, seniors, and pets. Our Service Learning Program combines peerbased education about a community need with hands-on volunteer opportunities, allowing youth in upper-elementary a "deep dive" into a specific issue. Serving alongside their peers, each youth participant also brainstorms, plans, and implements their own personal extension project to finish the program. Whether a donation drive, large-scale volunteer project, or education piece, this extension project is an outward expression of how the next generation is ready to take action!

EXTENSION PROJECTS IN ACTION



Delaney (now 9) hosted a backyard carnival to benefit Safe in Austin. With the support of her friends and family, Delaney raised \$500 to assist the rescue organization in paying for vet bills.



Addison (now 12) worked with her principal to host a school-wide supply drive for Austin Creative Reuse, educating peers about waste reduction, and diverting over 100 arts and crafts supply items from landfills by donating them directly to Austin Creative Reuse.

Sylas Meyer (now 9) started an origami bookmark awareness campaign in support of Austin Humane Society's Rescue Readers program! Making over 100 bookmarks by hand, Sylas passed them out to his classmates and via display boxes at Austin Public Libraries, with the goal of getting more kids volunteering as Rescue Readers.





Lucas (now 12) hosted a candy fundraiser and donation drive to benefit Foster Village. Collecting 416 diapers, 510 wipes, new clothing, toiletries, and 5 convertible car seats, the donations will help Foster Village in their mission to support and serve local foster families.

TEEN LEADERSHIP

Through our summer-based Teen Leadership Program, 42 teens trained to effectively lead adults and children in volunteer service, supporting our Family Volunteering Program. They collectively contributed 1,313 hours to the community while learning lifelong skills such as public speaking, problem solving, and group facilitation. Of these graduates, 26 decided to continue leading activities into the academic year! While our summer was certainly busy, the rest of the year was no exception! Our Teen Advisory Board collaborated to mobilize their peers through the expansion of Teen Service Day offerings, where likeminded peers serve side-by-side.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS

The inaugural Future Leaders in Service Scholarship was awarded to Sophia De Leon.

The TAB built out its structure to include Outreach/Social Media, Networking/Teen Service Days, Fundraising Committees.

We hosted **54 Teen Service Days** events with **24 partners** that engaged **608 teens** in service!

The TAB created their own mission statement: **"to empower** teen leaders to take initiative in creating positive change in our community" and adapted core values of Collaboration, Integrity, and Innovation.

HOUSTON

In October of 2019, after many months of preparation and planning, Generation SERVE launched a pilot of our Family Volunteering Program into Houston! By year's end, we had coordinated over 65 unique volunteer opportunities in support of nearly 20 nonprofit partners. Over 200 unique children served alongside a parent or caregiver, adding up to a collective 1,077 service hours for the Houston community in just three months!

Participant Nikki and her son, Jag (10), pictured, jumped on board within the first few weeks, prioritizing volunteering together at least once a month (and often more frequently!) Nikki told us, "Finding a resource like Generation SERVE has provided exactly what I have been needing for years and has made our desire to give our time so easy! Showing [Jag] that there are needs outside of his own has made him more compassionate and aware. He loves the way he feels after he chooses to spend his free time helping in the community." From sorting book donations, to making toys for animals at a shelter, to planting trees as a local park, Nikki shared that she loves the variety of ways Generation SERVE enables children and families to give back.

Jag reflected on his experience, chiming in, "I really look forward to our Generation SERVE opportunities and am excited to continue doing more for as long as I can. I would maybe even like to someday become a teen leader and help even more!"

Generation SERVE coordinates meaningful service experiences for youth and families, engaging children in volunteerism and empowering them to make a difference in their communities. Through age-appropriate, hands-on, and fun family volunteer activities, service learning projects, and teen leadership opportunities, children learn the lifelong value of giving while providing vital support for our partner nonprofit organizations.

Since being founded in 2009, Generation SERVE has directly coordinated 7,524 volunteer activities, contributing 110,238 hours of service. This collective power of volunteerism has resulted in an inkind donation of over \$137,798 to our Austin and Houston communities. We remain committed to making our mission a movement, demonstrated most recently by our pilot expansion into Houston!
